

Vocabulary



- disguise: to change your usual appearance, voice etc. so that people will not recognize you.
- merchant: someone who buys and sells goods.

- **beggar:** someone who lives by asking people for food and money.

- crowd: a large number of people gathered together.
- Claiming: saying that something is true, even though it has not been proved.
- ignorant: lacking knowledge [not knowing facts or information that you should know].
- Servant: someone who is paid to work for another in the other's house [doing jobs such as cooking and cleaning].

- **butcher:** someone who owns or works in a shop that sells meat.
- grabbed: seized with a sudden rough movement.

- Tecognize: to know someone or something because you have seen them before.

- u stable: a building where horses are kept. إسطبل
- whip: a long thin piece of leather or rope with a handle, used for making animals move faster or for hitting people as a punishment.
- indication: a sign that something exists or is likely to be true.
