Gerunds and infinitives

(Unit 7)—pages 19, 20

Common Verbs followed by an infinitive with 'to'

Agree, appear, afford, ask, arrange.

Ex.

I can't afford to buy a new overcoat.

Look at the book page 19.

Common verbs followed by objective+ infinitive with 'to'

Advise, allow, ask, command, encourage.

Ex.

He encouraged me to try again.

Look at the book page 19.

Verbs followed by a gerund or an infinitive with a different in meaning.

Remember, forget, stop, can't bear/stand, prefer

Ex.

I remember walking along the beach holding hands.

Did you remember to tell Hala about the party?

Notice:

The gerund is used when the action happens before remembering; the infinitive refers to an action that happens after.
